Participants will experience four days of tours and presentations at area businesses and industries, focusing on the future content of technology and the needs of the changing workforce.

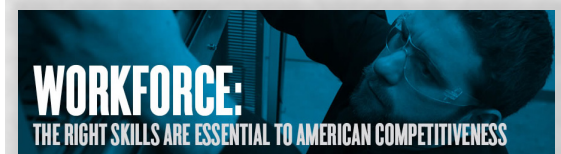
Target Audience
